PRESIDENT'S HOLIDAY MESSAGE

The holidays will be here before we know it! NWCAC would like to wish everyone a very Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah, Happy Kwanza, and best wishes for 2019!

As we celebrate, many times memories return of past holidays. As the daughter of a Swedish carpenter, I learned in my early years an important rule for life—"Measure twice, Cut once". This rule guided us when putting up the Christmas tree as well. When we set up our real tree, Mom was on one side and my brother and I on opposite sides while Dad held the "plumb" to be sure the tree was straight. A little later, we noticed that the tree was slightly slanted to one side. As Dad double-checked to see why, we noticed that Inga (the cat) was proudly sitting in the tree!

Another life changing memory occurred in December 1986. We were in Sweden for Christmas and visiting family. On December 27th, there was a large party for my Uncle's birthday and all the family was there. Suddenly, my 7 y/o daughter ran to get me. "Mommy, come quick, MorMor (my Mom) is on the floor". We quickly found my Mom unresponsive and pulseless. My husband and I began CPR—cardiac compressions and ventilations. All I could think about was that we were in Sweden and my brother was not there with us. I prayed as we continued CPR. I noticed movement and found a pulse! Transporters arrived and quickly transported her to the local hospital in the station wagon! She survived and lived another 18 years. She gave life to me at birth and I, in return, gave life back to her. As I look back, I know that there is a reason that I became a nurse and I am so grateful!

We care for patients in our facilities when they are ill. We have cared for so many that it may be hard to remember each and every one that we have cared for. I am sure that you may have had a similar occurrence happen to you—whether you are at the store, library, or anywhere in the community. One afternoon, I was at the American Daughters' of Sweden Christmas luncheon. A lady came up to me and said, "Judy, it's you!" She reached out her hand to me. "You were there! I will never forget you!" Quickly my mind raced to try to remember where I had been, and the instance where I must have met this lady. She went on, "Thank you for being there! She's doing well now!" As we talked, she reminded me that I had been at her mother's code blue. After we stabilized her mother, I helped support her

through this traumatic experience. I was glad that her mother is doing well now and able to celebrate the holidays with her family.

Through nursing knowledge and expert clinical data and information, healthcare has improved patient outcomes. As we share our collective voices, and make those voices heard, our strength emerges.



Our Voice Our Strength

11am: It was a typical morning at school when a teacher walked into the nurse's office complaining of SOB. The teacher was anxious and eyes wide open. The Certified School Nurse (CSN) Janice asked me to step in and assess the teacher. The nurse's office is part of a larger room that also contains Physical therapists, Occupational Therapists and Speech Therapists (32 staff).

I took a pulse ox: 70. The teacher's B/P 180/100 and Heart Rate 125. The teacher stated she had no past medical history (cardiac, respiratory or allergies,) and that she had no one to pick her up at school. My first response was to call 911. The teacher said she wanted to go home and get some rest and if she still did not feel good she would go to the immediate care center. I talked to the teacher in a low calm voice and told her we could not let her go home at this time because her pulse ox was so low. Janice, CSN asked what would I advise. I advised to immediately call 911. The vital signs did not improve. Janice called the principal and the principal wanted to come and talk to the teacher. I said time is of the essence! The principal arrived and started talking and talking and talking....I interrupted the principal and said "I am here to "Stand Up and be counted and called 911". The ambulance arrived at 11:15am and took the teacher to the closest university hospital and the teacher was taken immediately to surgery". In the meantime after the ambulance left, I was instructed by the CSN that I had to apologize to the principal. As Dave Hansen always said, "Nurses always make it look too easy".




Directions to the Chapter Meeting
